The Stories We Told

We at 3 Generations are proud of the amount of content and topics we were able to create. A short overview is shared below:



2023 was a year of international outreach and women's justice storytelling.

At the beginning of 2023, 3 Generations stood for the now-overthrown 50th Anniversary of the landmark Roe v. Wade decision. We followed that up by launching our Intergenerational Voices Initiative.

Then in February, we celebrated Random Act of Kindness Day by partnering with Global Giving to amplify the voices of Native American women.

In March we announced the judges for our 3rd Annual Youth Video Contest. The judges included award-winning British actor, Dame Harriet Walter. We then honored Women's History Month by featuring a new video series titled Women's Words and produced a video with Alexandra McDougall of White Earth Ojibwe and the Ain Dah Yung Center. Our film crew traveled to Amsterdam once again to conclude location filming on our feature documentary, HERE LIVED.

We extended our partnership with Global Giving to raise awareness about the many intersecting issues for women with a week-long small donations campaign. A powerful partnership with the Museum of the Moving Image and 3 Generations, featured Jane Wells, Dr. Steve Carr & Dr. Laura Cohen in discussion and screening of the German Concentration Camps Factual Survey (2014). Still keeping busy in April, we interviewed Jordan Davidson of Smart Approaches to Marijuana to produce a short video on 420 and the dangers of marijuana.

In May we honored Mental Health Awareness Month by sharing quotes on social media from our subjects over the years.

HEAR THEIR STORIES: DEMAND CHANGE

With the announcement of the winners of our 3rd Annual Youth Video Contest in June, we welcomed the filmmakers and judges for a virtual awards ceremony. 3 Generations announced our newest feature film HERE LIVED.

In August Jane Wells was honored to receive the Best Female Director Award at the New York Tri-state Film Festival for Preserving the Holocaust (2021).

As the fall rolled around, 3 Generations shared an exclusive behind-the-scenes look at the process of recording the orchestral soundtrack for HERE LIVED featuring Brian Keane, renowned film score composer, at Carriage House Studios. In September 3G participated in NYC Climate Week by partnering with GreenFaith US leaders to photograph and film protests to End Fossil Fuels. Additionally, we published a video documenting individuals of all generations' viewpont on the effects of Climate Change.

A Kaddish for Selim (2022) was selected in October as part of the Tokyo International Short Film Festival. Preserving the Holocaust (2021) won the Best Short Documentary award at the Toronto Indie Filmmakers Festival

On October 26th, 3 Generations celebrated its 15th anniversary with an evening at the Crosby Street Hotel. This momentous ocassion included a private screening of HERE LIVED, followed by a discussion with Caroline Moorehead, award-winning Human Rights Author & Journalist, and Emile Schrijver, General Director of the Jewish Cultural Quarter in Amsterdam.


